

Quality Assurance & Control

A Category C permit (Archaeological Resource Impact Assessment) is required in order to conduct such assessments in the province of Nova Scotia. A permit is issued to an eligible applicant by the curator of Special Places, Nova Scotia Museum Heritage Division only if they meet the minimum requirements set forth. An applicant must be able to demonstrate relevant ability through training and experience and he/she must be in compliance with all conditions of previous permits held in Nova Scotia. Davis MacIntyre & Associates' personnel have met, and in many cases exceeded, the requirements of all previous permits held.
